Midnight Ramble **October 20-21, 2 pm**

A fascinating look at the black film industry in America from 1910-1950, describing the entertaining and informative films that captured black audiences around the country. Pays tribute to the entrepreneurial determination and creativity of those who started the production companies, made the films, and created the distribution network that came to be known as the Midnight Ramble circuit. Conveys how black values and life styles were portrayed in a realistic and positive manner by black filmmakers, as opposed to stereotypes perpetuated by Hollywood. Post-film discussion features film historian and producer Pamela Thomas.

The Cats of Mirikitani **November 27-29, 7 pm**

Blending beauty and humor with tragedy and loss, *The Cats of Mirikitani* is an intimate exploration of the lingering wounds of war and the healing power of art. A heart-warming affirmation of humanity that will appeal to all lovers of art, peace and cats. Special appearance by director Linda Hattendorf, to discuss the film and it's subject, artist Jimmy Mirikitani.

Forever **December 18-20, 7 pm**

A delicate, measured work of unexpected wisdom and hope that preserves the mysteries of love, art, and memory. It conveys equally and elegantly the loving devotion of the living to the departed, and the redemptive, revitalizing power of art.
